FUTSAL LEAGUE

Our ever-popular 5-a-side indoor soccer Spring program conducted at Ashburton Pool & Recreational Centre (APARC) commences on Friday 4th September and will finish in December 2019.

Age Groupings:

The age groupings are:

U8, U10, U12 and All-Abilities – Saturday mornings (8.00am – 12pm)

U7/8, U12, U14, U16 and U18 – Friday nights (4.45pm – 9.30pm)

- All players **must** wear shin pads. These will be available to purchase from the club at the start of the indoor season for any player wishing to do so. Your child will not be able to take the field without the appropriate attire (indoor shoes, shin guards, no watches or jewellery).

Costs

- \$260.00 per person player. These amounts **include** Football Federation Victoria affiliation, and insurance costs for each player. All payments are made through playfootball.com.au. All you need is your child's FFA number and your password.
- **Please note that competitions will only take place where there is demand. In some cases, this may mean teams being reorganised after the first two weeks of grading matches into other leagues.**
- **Note: Due to the winter outdoor season finishing on Sunday 1st September for most teams the indoor season will start the following week. The first two weeks (6/7th and 13/14th) will be grading rounds to ensure the appropriate level of competition for all players and teams.**

How to Apply

- **Team Entry:** The Team Manager must fill in the Jotform on behalf of the team (<https://www.jotform.com/AshburtonUnited/ausc-fl-2019>). You do not need to have a full team when your first register, you can let us know as you add extra players in or we can find children to fill the extra spots.
- **Individual Entry:** Those without a team can still apply as an individual entry by submitting the Jotform (<https://www.jotform.com/AshburtonUnited/ausc-fl-2019>). You can list any friends or team mates you would like your child to play with on this form.
- **Players & Parents Code of Behaviour:** by signing registration form all players and parents agree to abide by the attached codes of behaviour.
- **Fixture and Rules of Competition** will be issued after grading has been completed. We are not able to negotiate fixture times and once they have been released they are final. If your team is unable to fulfil a scheduled fixture, you must let AUSC know two weeks in advance so a replacement team can be found. This will still be listed as a forfeit for your side.
- **Grading for sections:** grading will be conducted for the first 2 weeks of the competition of each competition. At this point you or your teams may be regraded to the league most competitively suitable.

PARENTS CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- Remember that children play sports for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Our futsal program gives children a break from the more serious outdoor season. They do not need coaching or instructing, they will learn on their own.
- Focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- Encourage children to always participate according to the rules.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making mistakes or losing a game.
- Remember that children learn best by example. Applaud good play by all teams.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise. All referees have come through the Ashy referees training program and are still learning. Just as we would not allow you to abuse or argue with a child playing in the game, no parents or spectators are permitted to talk to the referees at any stage.
- Show appreciation and respect for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not participate.

PLAYERS' CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- Play by the rules.
- Never argue with an official. They are learning, just like you, and without them you would not be able to play.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in any sport.
- Work equally hard for yourself and/or your team. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you.
- Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether your team or the opposition makes them.
- Treat all participants in your sport, as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor.
- Cooperate with your teammates and opponents. Without them there would be no competition.
- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents and coaches.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

We agree to abide by the rules of the parents and players code of conduct. Any violation of these rules could see you removed from the venue and barred from further attendance without refund.
